
A warm welcome to Oliver in Year 1 who has joined our school. We hope you will be very happy here!

We were grateful to receive a grant from Ward Councillor Funding of £2350 towards this work.

'New' school uniform

Low immunity danger

Sophie (Year 4) is receiving medication for juvenile idiopathic arthritis. Similarly to Fabienne (Year 2), her immunity to a variety of illnesses including Chickenpox, Measles, Mumps, Shingles, Slapped Cheek and Scarlet Fever can put Sophie at serious risk. Fabienne's immunity still remains compromised putting her potentially at serious life-threatening risk. If your child becomes ill - and in particular with one of the illnesses listed above - then please ensure that you let the school office know as soon as possible. Thank you.

Infant entrance to school

Often in the morning it can be congested and a long wait for the infant children to enter the school building, which leads to a loss of learning time. Please can children now line up outside of the door they exit at the end of each day ready to be greeted by their class teacher. Miss. Farrar and Miss. Kane will be at their doors by around 8.45 a.m. and Mrs. Rigby as Deputy will be available outside from around 8.40 a.m. so parents are able to share any urgent information that teachers need to know that Teachers of course will make themselves available as much as possible at the end of the school day for other conversations with parents. We will close the classroom doors as soon as the last child has entered at 8.50 a.m. This will hopefully ensure a much quicker and more effective system at the start of the school day.
