### Low immunity danger

**Sophie** (Year 5) is receiving medication for juvenile idiopathic arthritis. Similarly to **Fabienne** (Year 3), her immunity to a variety of illnesses including Chickenpox, Measles, Mumps, Shingles, Slapped Cheek and Scarlet Fever can put Sophie at **serious risk**. Fabienne's immunity still remains compromised putting her potentially at **serious life-threatening risk**. If your child becomes ill - and in particular with one of the illnesses listed above - then please ensure that you let the school office know as soon as possible.

## Allergies in school

A reminder that several children in school are highly allergic to nuts and one child has a life-threatening allergy to sesame seeds and products containing sesame. We take all our children's safety extremely seriously and as such the school wide ban on nuts and sesame remains in force until further notice. Thank you for your continued vigilance and support.

The **Infant (3.30-4.30) disco** plan is as follows:

- All Infants will be dismissed as usual at 3.15 p.m. However, children who are staying to the disco do NOT need to be collected. Please provide your child with their change of clothes in the morning, and teachers will help children to change and take them safely to the disco at 3.30 p.m.
- The entry fee is £4.00 which is to be paid by Thursday please via Parent Pay. This will mean children can go straight to the disco and not worry about handing the correct change over. The £4.00 covers the entrance to the disco, a snack, drink and a glowstick. There is no need for your child to bring any other money.

## The Junior (4.45-5.45) disco plan is as follows:

- Please collect your child as usual at 3.25 p.m. and bring them back to school at 4.45 p.m.
- The entry fee is £4.00 which is to be paid by
