I'm sure this doesn't surprise you to hear, as I know the community and values of the school are held so importantly, but I still wanted to let you know!'

Well done to all who took part. Our Year 5 girls came 2<sup>nd</sup>, Year 5 boys came 3<sup>rd</sup>, and Year 6 girls and boys also came



3<sup>rd</sup> out of the twelve teams competing. A particular well done to Millie in Year 6 who came 3<sup>rd</sup> overall and Arlo D who came 1<sup>st</sup> out of the 50+ runners in their categories!

## School Health Survey – from Clare Squires, School Nurse

We have received the results of the recent School Health survey and are really pleased with so many great achievements. I wanted to share some of the findings.

- In particular, 94% of Bathwick pupils were active for at least 60 minutes on five days or more in the week before the survey compared with 64% in the rest of the BANES.
- 84% of Bathwick Pupils feel their achievements are recognised at school compared with 57% with rest of BANES
- 97% Pupils responded that their teachers listen to them at school.
- Similarly, 97% of Bathwick Pupils think their school takes bullying seriously compared with 77% in BANES.
- Pupils who feel their achievements are recognised outside school at Bathwick is 84% compared to 64% in other BANES Schools
- Pupils who are 'quite' or 'very' happy with their life at the moment is 90% here compared to 76% in the rest of BANES

This is a fantastic achievement for Bathwick St. Mary made possible by a brilliant partnership between school and parents. Well done all! However – we always strive to provide the best for all our children and as such realise there is always work to do to support all our children.

## Do you have any unwanted coats, hats or gloves?

Well done to Jessica, Anna, Josh and Ruben who completed a charity 5k family fun run in aid of Dorothy House



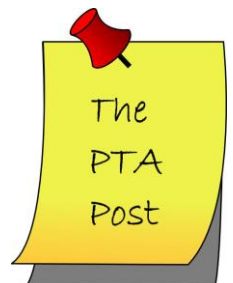
Hospice recently. They had the option to dress in their pyjamas and luckily the rain had stopped too!

## Severe weather

## PTA Discos - Friday 15th November

The first disco this year will be held on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> November. The cost of this will be £4 per child, payable via ParentPay.



The **Infants disco** is from 3:30 until

4:30 and each child will receive a snack and a drink. Any children wishing to attend can bring their clothes with them to school in the morning and staff will help children get changed for the disco by 3.30 p.m. Parents then don't need to collect until 4.30 p.m.

The **Junior disco** will be 4:45 until 5:45 p.m. and children will receive a snack and drink. There will be an opportunity for the juniors to purchase extra snacks so a small amount of tuck money would be advised.

If Juniors wish to stay at school before their disco at 4:45, they can be booked into After School club (<https://bathwickstmary.schoolipal.co.uk/>) for the end of school day to 4:30, where staff will ensure they can get changed and go straight to the disco at 4:45. Infants who want to stay to Wraparound care after the disco can book into the 4:30-5:30 session.

Please note that Parents will only be allowed into school to collect their child. Unless you are listed as a helper, parents will not be allowed to stay within the school for the duration of the disco. ### Low immunity danger

**Sophie** (Year 6) is receiving medication for juvenile idiopathic arthritis. Similarly to **Fabienne** (Year 4), her immunity to a variety of illnesses including Chickenpox, Measles, Mumps, Shingles, Slapped Cheek and Scarlet Fever can put Sophie at **serious risk**. Fabienne's immunity remains compromised putting her potentially at **serious life-threatening risk**. If your child becomes ill - and in particular with one of the illnesses listed above - then please ensure that you let the school office know as soon as possible.

### Allergies in school

A reminder that several children in school are highly allergic to nuts and one child has a **life-threatening allergy** to sesame seeds and products containing sesame (sesame can be found on or in a variety of food, including on rolls, bread, oil, hummus). We take all our children's safety extremely seriously and as such the **school wide ban on nuts and sesame products remains in force until further notice**. Thank you for your continued vigilance and support.
