
Dear Year One,




Discuss with your grown up.  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> On one of your daily walks, look at the different houses and buildings around you. What materials do you think they are made from? Why do you think materials like glass and bricks are used? Visit http://www.crickweb.co.uk/ks1/science.html#materials and see if you can label the house correctly.

<p>Day 2</p>	<p>To Write a story about the animal builders. Can you write another adventure for the animal builders?</p> <p>What do they build? Who is working on site? What mischief does pig get up to?</p> <p>Here is the start of mine:</p> <p>One day the Animal builders were called to a job on the beach. The crabs wanted to build a new sandcastle house. Donkey led the team. Pig fell asleep on the way.</p>	<p>Can I make and describe arrays? How many fish are there in each column? How many fish are there in each row? How many fish are there altogether? Can you make your own arrays and describe them? You can draw them in your book or make them with objects or counters.</p> 	<p>Geography Last week you looked at the location of your home and our school on google maps.</p> <p>Draw a map from your house to school. Think about what you see on the way. Trees, friend's houses, bridges, Sydney gardens? Make sure you draw some key landmarks on it! Make it colourful and bold. You could even write your address or postcode on the map if you can remember it from last week.</p> 
<p>Day 3</p>	<p>Design a 'Keep Safe on a building' site poster.</p> <p>Watch the video about building Site Safety.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tnxeP-NrdWA</p> <p>Can you design a poster that shows people how to keep safe on a building site? What should they wear? What should they do/not do?</p>	<p>Can I solve problems using arrays?</p> <p>Mo and Libby are making arrays.</p>  <p>Who has made a mistake? Explain why. Challenge: Can you make up your own problem using arrays?</p>	<p>RE: Think about the story of The Lost Son from last week's learning. The father shows the Christian values of love and forgiveness. Christians believe that God is loving and forgiving like a parent. Draw an outline of a parent. Inside, write or draw what parents do or say to show they love their children. On the outside, draw or write what children do or say to show they love their parents.</p>
