Watch my video to find out more!</p> <p>Your task: Create a fact file or a 'wanted' poster all about Darwin and his work in the Galapagos islands in particular. What did he discover? What did the finches show him? What was his theory about the origin of the species? See an example on Tapestry.</p>
<p>Thursday</p> <p>Home</p>	<p>'Syria research'</p> <p>Today you will learn about refugees from Syria. To start with, spend some time watching videos, reading through the information about Syria and why this led to people becoming refugees. Use the newsround link below:</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/newsround/16979186</p> <p>In your book note down what you have found out. The war in Syria is quite complicated so just learn the basics. Remember our visit from the KES teacher and author Catherine Bruton and her brilliant book 'No ballet shoes in Syria'. She was inspired by this awful situation and chose to write a book.</p> <p>Your task: use your 5 senses (touch, taste, smell, hear, sight) to describe in a short written piece what is so special about your home. Try to use sentences such as; 'My favourite tastes at home are...'; 'This smell reminds me of home...'; 'When I hear ... I know I am home' and so on.</p> <p>Challenge: Think about the importance of home, and how it would feel to have to live somewhere different, for example in a refugee camp. What if you didn't feel safe in your home? Would some aspects of home stay the same, and others change? Can you write a comparison with how you feel about your home.</p>	<p>Marvellous Money – Lesson 2:</p> <p>Yesterday, we looked at money handling questions. Today, we are going to do more problem solving problems involving money!</p> <p>Today's questions are a longer word problems (like yesterday's Challenge question). Have a go at solving them, making sure you show your working out fully!</p> <p>Challenge: There is a challenge question at the end of the sheet.</p>	<p>R.E.</p> <p>We are going to look at Islamic patterns today. In many Islamic countries, buildings including mosques are decorated with elaborate tile patterns.</p> <p>First, look through the PowerPoint. Think about the shapes that are being used and how they are used – how have they been repeated? Looking at the images of Islamic tiles, can you spot any of those shapes from the slides?</p> <p>Next, use the instruction guide to draw out this shape grid:</p>  <p>Then, you can either keep just one pattern, or you can repeat this pattern. Finally, using coloured pencils, fill in with colour where you want to make shapes. You can colour across the lines to create different unique shapes:</p>
