Key achievements to date until July 2020:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Woodland area in school grounds have continued to provide OWL (Outdoor Woodland Learning) Adventures on Thursdays for all classes across the school. Outdoor woodland activities allow children to develop their physical skills and encourage children to partake in movement throughout the day (including den building and team games). The woodland area is also used for a weekly after-school club and Wednesday afternoons for Reception to use for 'Wellington Wednesday', contributing towards key areas of the development in the EYFS curriculum. ○ Bath & District School Games Netball ○ BANES Hi 5 Netball Tournament ○ Prior Park Biathlon - Well done to Toby (U11 Boys), Isla and Keisha (U10 Girls) and Rosie (U12 Girls) who each qualified to take part in the British Schools Modern Biathlon Championships which were due to be held at University of Bath Sports Training Village at the end of March (due to COVID-19 this was unable to take place). ○ B&NES Year 5/6 Gymnastics Competition - Congratulations to our Year 5 and 6 gymnasts: Cherry, Max, Kitty V, Orla, Natalie, Sophie, Yasemin and Millie T. Our Year 6 team came 4th overall. ○ Congratulations to Darcey and Orla who have had more success with their synchronised swimming. On Saturday 23rd November, the girls competed as a duet in the Swim England South West Duet Competition in Plymouth. The girls came 3rd out of 11 in their category. ○ On Friday 13th December we supported the charities 'Save the Children' and 'Dorothy House'. Children wore a Christmas or festive jumper for Save the Children and also took part in an 'Elf run' at school. ○ B&NES SSP Cross Country for Year 5 and 6 (Boys and Girls) Well done to all who took part. Our Year 5 girls came 2nd, Year 5 boys came 3rd, and Year 6 girls and boys also came 3rd out of the twelve teams competing. A particular well done to Millie in Year 6 who came 3rd overall and Arlo D who came 1st out of the 50+ runners in their categories! ○ Children in Year 3 and 4 competed in the B&NES Year 3 and 4 Gymnastics Competition in March 2020 – particular well done to Scarlett who came 1st overall in Year 4 and the Year 4 Level 1 team (Freya, Abigail, Scarlett, Sebby and Guy) who were placed 3rd. ○ In February 2020, Year 5 and 6 swimmers competed at the B&NES Swimming Gala. The swimmers came 1st overall and came home with the trophy.
