

# Year 2 Term 1 Geography: Where in the world does a tiger live?



**Curriculum Key Question:** Where have we come from?  
**Topic:** Where in the world does a tiger live?

To name the four countries that make the UK and name the capital cities of the UK.

To use atlases to locate the UK and identify and name the 7 continents of the world.

To identify where tigers inhabit (locate China on a map) and to learn about tigers being endangered.

To draw a simple map and understand what life is like for people in China.

To compare what life is like in different countries (China and the UK).

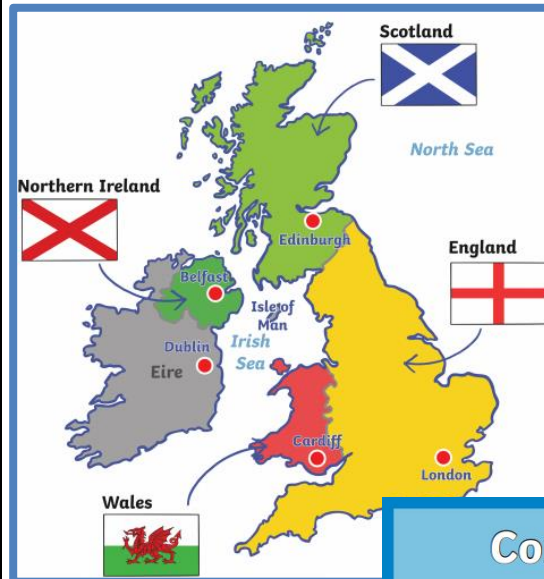
To ask questions to find out what places are like and compare school life in China (Beijing) and the UK (my own school).

## What should I already know?

- Name and locate some places in Bath, the UK and the wider world.
- Name and locate seas of the UK.
- Describe some similarities and differences when studying places.
- Draw picture maps.

## Skills I will develop:

- Name and locate significant places in Bath, the UK, and the wider world.
- Name the countries that make up the UK and the capital cities.
- Name and locate seven continents and five oceans.
- Describe places and features using simple geographical vocabulary (including beach, cliff, coast, ocean, river, valley).
- Ask and answer simple geographical questions when investigating different places and environments.
- Use an infant atlas.



## Key Vocabulary

- Culture** – the 'way of life' of a country or group of people, e.g. tradition, dress, language, religion.
- Human-made** – built by humans.
- Landmarks** – important objects or features of the landscape.
- Population** – the number of people living there.
- Weather** – the conditions outside on a given day, including temperature and rainfall.
- China** – a country in East Asia.
- United Kingdom** – The United Kingdom, made up of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, is an island nation in northwestern Europe.
- Continents** – A continent is a large solid area of land.
- Endangered** – An animal or plant is endangered when there are so few left alive on the planet that the entire species is in danger of vanishing forever.
- Map** - A map is a drawing of all or part of Earth's surface.
