Curriculum Key Question: How can I look after myself and others?
Topic: Where in the world does a tiger live?

To tell the key points of the story of Jonah from the Bible and recognise a link with the concept of God.

To give clear, simple accounts of what the text means to Christians.

To give an example of a way in which Christians use the story of Jonah to guide their beliefs about God.

To give at least two examples of how Christians put their beliefs into practice in worship.

To think, talk and ask questions about whether they can learn anything from the story for themselves, exploring different ideas.

Key Vocabulary

- **Parable** - a special story told by Jesus to help people learn or understand ideas. Parables have hidden meanings.
- **Forgiveness** - the act of forgiving someone.
- **Christian** - a person who believes in God and Jesus. Follows Christianity.
- **Hymn** - songs that are sung for a celebration- to feel happy.
- **Prayers** - an object of worship, someone sharing their expression of thanks or a request for help from God.
- **Church** - a place used for Christian Worship. The Christian family/community.
