

MFL vision statement – A year 6 leaver.



At Bathwick St Mary, we strongly believe that the study of Primary Languages prepares pupils to participate in a rapidly changing, multi-cultural society in which work and other activities are increasingly carried out in languages other than English. Our year 6 leaver pupils will be able to use languages to communicate information carefully, responsibly, creatively and with growing confidence. Our children will learn in a fun, interactive and engaging environment where they are free to participate without fear of making mistakes. All the children in KS2 will have formal French lessons weekly with a focus on oral learning as they begin, building up to written recording of simple sentences and short paragraphs. Our hope is that our year 6 leaver is able to express their ideas and thoughts in French and to also to be able to understand and respond to French speakers, both in speech and writing. The use of high quality books, images, films and songs greatly enhances the learning experiences for all. It is intended that when children leave Bathwick, they will have a natural curiosity and confidence to explore, other countries, cultures and languages, accepting that, in a multi-lingual society it is a valuable skill to be able to communicate effectively with others in another language. They will be engaged and prepared to continue language learning at Secondary school.
