Curriculum Key Question: How can I express myself? Topic: Where does our food come from?

Spelling rules:

- Adding the suffic -ous (no change to root word).
- Adding the suffic -ous (no definitive root word.)

- Adding the suffix -ous (words ending in 'e' drop the 'e' but not 'a').

- To use subordinating conjunctions.
- To use expanded noun phrases.

- To consolidate word classes.

Writing:

- 1. To analyse the book George's Marvellous Medicine to write a character study. To discuss adjectives which
- describe appearance and those which describe manner.2. To write a persuasive speech, using speech punctuation,
- 2. To write a persuasive speech, using speech punctuation, based on the character of George. To use performance techniques to show these speeches
- 3. To create a diary stye recount, in the past tense, with informal language based on George's Marvellous Medicine.
- 4. To compare and contrast Roald Dahl Revolting Rhymes poems. To use this to inform writing of our own poem.



Reading:

- Continuting to introduce VIPERS skills in comprehension lessons and whole class shared reading sessions. Focus mainly on vocabularly, retriveal and explain quetsions whilst building up to inference questions.
- Focus on adding detail to these answers and being able to articulate answers clearly. Add some evidence to answers.
- Promoting a love of reading through a good, themed book corner, book of the term and class stories at the end of the day. Children are heard to read in front of the class and on a 1:1 basis regularly.
