














Key Vocabulary:

Seam/ Seam allowance: extra fabric allowed around the edges for joining pieces together.

Upper: the top part of the slipper.
Sole: the bottom part of a slipper.
Wadding; the stuffing that is put
between the outer fabric.

Template: a shape drawn to the exact shape and size that is laid onto fabric to help with cutting out.

Pattern pieces: all the template parts needed to make up one whole slipper.

Tacking: large running stitches to hold together pieces of fabric temporarily.

Mock up: 3D model made of cheaper materials and joined easily to check size and shape.

Specification: describes what a product has to do.

Working drawing: detailed drawing contains all information needed to make product but is updated as changes are made.
