Steam train - A train that uses steam from boiling water to make it move.

George Stephenson - The engineer responsible for the creation of railways

Wright Brothers - The first people to successfully fly in a plane.

Hot air balloon - A way of travelling in the air before aeroplanes. Mostly used by rich people.

Electric - Worked by electricity

Windrush generation - People who came from the Caribbean to Britain over 70 years ago.

Able to label a historical timeline with words such as: past, present, old and new.

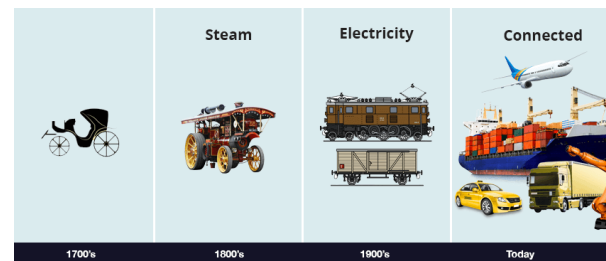
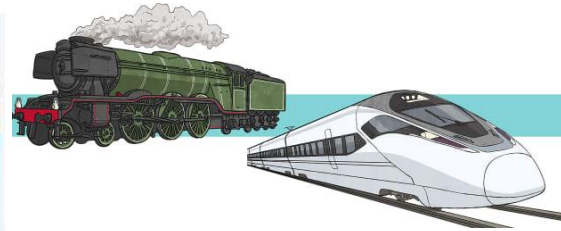
Able to look at sources about early forms of travel such as Viking long boats and ask questions about them.
