RE – What is it like to be a Hindu?



Curriculum Key Question: How do I express myself?
Topic: Earth and Space

What should I already know?

In Year 1 we looked at:

Special Times (How and why do Hindus celebrate Diwali?)

and Special Places where people worship. We learnt that:

- Hindus are people who follow the religion Hinduism.
- The story of Rama and Sita is important to Hindus and linked to the festival of light, Diwali.
- The festival of Diwali is a celebration of light conquering darkness.
- You might see Diva lamps being lit during Diwali.
- Hindus worship in a Mandir.

By the end of this unit pupils should know:

- for many Hindus, Brahman is the supreme being
- although Hindus may have images of different deities, this does not necessarily mean they believe in many different gods and goddesses
- when Hindus are focusing on a deity, they are often thinking about one aspect of Brahman
 ...
- ideas about Brahman can affect the way Hindus live their lives

Pupils will know:

- Many Hindus try to live good lives by following their dharma.
- Dharma is different for different people.
- Many Hindus believe there are four goals or purposes for everyone.
- Some Hindus also have daily activities/duties to perform.



Main Beliefs – Dharma

Hindus believe that there are right and wrong ways to behave.

Dharma is a complex idea that includes the right behaviour, following the moral law (and not just what you feel like doing) and taking <u>ones</u> duties seriously.

Dharma is a central part of a Hindu's daily life.

According to this belief, it is necessary to do the right thing at all times.

Moksha (release from the cycle of birth and rebirth)

Reincarnation

Hindus believe in reincarnation. Reincarnation is the belief that life is a cycle of birth, life, death and rebirth. When a person dies, they are then reborn as another living thing. This cycle can go on for thousands of lifetimes.

	happens to you in the next life.
