# How can I support my child's reading in Reception?

Learning to read fluently, with confidence and for enjoyment is without doubt one of the most important aspects of your child's education. Thank you to the Reception parents and carers who were able to come to the information session in September. Please make every effort to come to the next part of this – 2.50 p.m. on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November. All parents should have received an information pack from the first meeting - if you need further information, please see Miss Farrar or Miss Lozynskyj.

### How do I know my child is safe at school?

We are pleased that last academic year, 100% of parents who voted in the <u>Parent View survey</u> said their child feels safe here. Safeguarding always remains at the very top of our priorities. Thank you to our Safeguarding Governor, Mel Skeet, who recently observed lunchtime routines in both Infants and Juniors. She has also built in several 'Safeguarding Pupil Voice' meetings over the course of this year. These meetings enable Governors to hear first hand from children and then challenge the work of the school to help ensure children's safety remains paramount.

# Important reminders to help your children to focus on their learning...

Thank you for always ensuring your child is getting to school in time for the 8:50 – it has been a great start! As soon as children are in the learning day begins. Please allow your children to get settled into the school day and please do not knock on windows or try to get your child's attention as it disturbs their learning and the learning of others in their class. Thank you.

**'Smart' watches** that act as phones or messaging tools or can take photos or videos **are not permitted** in school as they can distract children from their learning.

The only **jewellery** items permitted are small ear studs if necessary.

Please remember your child needs a **waterproof coat**. We aim for children to be outside for play and lunchtime – even if it is wet – they need a coat with a hood please!

At the end of the day, <u>supervised</u> children are welcome to use the trim trail opposite the Wheatley Room for a few minutes until the after school clubs start and the gates are locked. However, <u>adults collecting children</u> MUST supervise and take responsibility for their children. Thank you for your support.

#### The importance of school attendance

In every newsletter and in regular communication we remind our community that no holidays are authorised in term time. Children make progress in their learning when they know more, remember more and are able to do more. #### Important safety notice

We have children in school who have lifethreatening allergies. We take all our children's safety extremely seriously and as such the following foods and foods containing these ingredients are banned from the school site (this includes bringing snacks after school for your children or during clubs time):

  - X Pine nuts and Pesto


