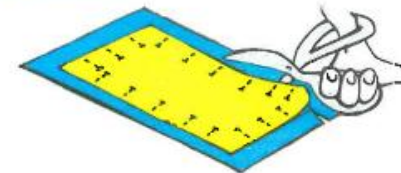
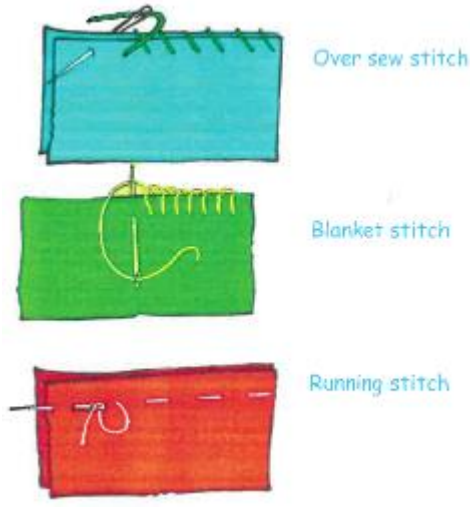
- Measure, tape or pin, cut and join fabric with some accuracy

- Evaluate their product against original design criteria e.g., how well it meets the intended purpose.

Cutting out techniques

Ensure template is secured to fabric to allow for accuracy. Double sided tape can be used instead of pins to do this.



Place pattern pieces carefully to avoid wastage.

Key Vocabulary (including definition)

Applique- means 'applied'- describes method of stitching/gluing patches onto fabric to provide decoration.

Pattern/ template- a shape drawn to exact shape and size and used to assist cutting out/

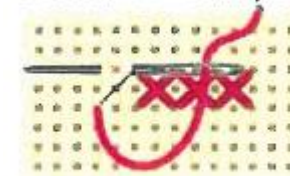
Seam- a line of stitching that joins pieces of fabric together.

Aesthetics- the way in which the product looks with the nature and expression of beauty.

Annotated sketch- a detailed sketch that is labelled.

Embellishments- a decorative detail or feature
