Safer Routes to School Update

Thank you to everyone who responded to the safer routes to school parent survey. These are the main headlines from both the parent and pupil surveys:

- 72% of pupils/families walk to school.
- 6% of pupils usually cycle however 34% of pupils said they would like to cycle to school.
- 84% of parent responses said that they would like to walk to school more often.

Comments about safety when travelling to school included wanting:

- Fewer cars on Darlington Road
- Better parking
- A pedestrian crossing on Warminster Road

28% of the parents who responded to the survey said they felt unsafe travelling to school. This is a concerning statistic and is something that the working party would like to work towards improving through ensuring greater awareness of safer travel in both pupils and parents.

You can still apply for benefit related free school meals while receiving universal infant free school meals. In addition, school provides a £50 voucher towards uniform should you successfully apply.

100 missed hours of learning...

EVERY CLASS had some children with unauthorised absence in January — a total of 40 sessions lost which equates to over 100 hours of missed learning. Children make progress in their learning when they know more, remember more and are able to do more. Our carefully sequenced curriculum is built around this pedagogy — and this is one of the key reasons why school attendance matters so much. Please ensure your child is only missing school when absolutely necessary. Thank you to the many parents & carers who already ensure this every day.


Important safety notice

We have children in school who have **life-threatening allergies.** We take all our children's safety extremely seriously and as such **the following foods and foods containing these ingredients are banned from the school site** (this includes bringing snacks after school for your children or during clubs time):

- Sesame seeds and food containing sesame (sesame can be found on or in a variety of food, including on rolls, bread, oil, hummus)
- Nuts and food containing nuts
 - X All 'Tree nuts' this includes cashew, hazelnuts, almonds, walnuts, pistachio, macadamia, pecan and Brazil nuts
 - X Peanuts and chestnuts
 - X Pine nuts and Pesto

Some food packing uses wording such as, 'This product has been produced in a factory that handles nuts and/or sesame' or 'May contain nuts and/or sesame'. We only ban foods that state nuts or sesame in the ingredient list.

West of England Bus Fares and 'Birthday Bus'

There are currently two bus fares initiatives, a capped fixed price of £2 for an adult single and a reduced single fare of £1 for children aged 5-15, with most bus public services across the West of England, although it excludes special school and college buses. This is in place until the end of March 2025, click travelwest for more details.

There is also a <u>'Birthday Bus'</u> initiative, where you can apply for free bus travel across the West of England, if you live within the West of England Mayoral Combined Authority area or in North Somerset. It's valid for the whole calendar month of your birthday and available to all ages, so staff and students can take advantage of the scheme.

Knife Crime Awareness Event for Parents and Carers

The B&NES Violence Reduction Partnership (VRP) are running a series of knife crime awareness events throughout February and March.
