We are open and honest	We provide information in an agreed timescale We are transparent and honest We respond promptly and follow up on agreed actions in the timescale agreed
We listen to each other	We listen to and respect each others views We make sure the child's voice is heard and acted upon
We do what matters	We focus on solutions with a 'can-do' approach We agree the outcomes we want and work towards them together There is a clear plan of action with an agreed date to review We will take responsibility for what we agree to do
We work together	We communicate clearly with each other We do what we say we will do or explain clearly why we cannot We agree timescales in how we respond to emails, phone calls, requests for a meeting

We look at the holistic child.


Commitment to SCHOOLS
