Walk or Wheel to School Week

Our school is taking part in Walk to School Week (20th – 24th May). The nationwide event is organised by walking charity Living Streets and designed to help pupils experience firsthand the importance of walking to school. Children will be well on their way to reaching their recommended minimum 60 minutes of physical activity per day before even reaching the school gates! Not only will it set them up for a positive day in the classroom, but it will also help create healthy habits for life. This year's challenge, The Magic of Walking, encourages children to travel actively to school every day of the week. Meeting various magical beings along the way, they'll learn about the important reasons to walk and the difference it can make for individuals, communities and the planet! Each pupil will be challenged to travel sustainably (walk, wheel, scoot, cycle or Park and Stride) to school for one week (or more) and to log their journeys.

As preparation for this week, we have organised for the Gloucestershire road safety team to be in school all day on 17th May to lead workshops on road safety with all classes.

We would ask, if possible, to make arrangements so that your child/children can travel actively to school on the week commencing 20th May, helping our school reduce congestion and pollution around the school gates. Walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling all count!

If you need to drive or take public transport, you could always sign up for our 'park and stride' scheme which we are piloting this week, on the Monday 20th and Wednesday 22nd May. You will be able to drop your child off by the entrance to the Holburne museum and we will then all walk to school together. If you would like to try this, then please do sign up using the forms link here, which also contains further details of times. We are looking for some adult volunteers to walk with us to school so if you are available please do see Mrs Elliott.

How can you keep your child safe online?

We recently marked Safer Internet Day at school where children reflected again on e-safety. Following a very successful event last year, we have again arranged for PC Megan Haldane from the Cyber Protect team in Avon & Somerset Police, to guide parents through the topic of online safety. Online safety is an ever-changing picture. This can make the job of keeping children safe online a difficult responsibility. We recognise the role you have in supporting healthy online habits and understanding the risks and challenges. Please do come along on **Wednesday** 5th June, 6pm – 7pm in the school hall. There are no tickets – please just turn up ready for a 6.00 start. Overview:

- Online risk: breaking down what the online risks are and how we can understand them better
- Mitigating the threat: a discussion around the technical and non-technical safeguarding measures
- Becoming more Cyber Aware: how we and those we support can be more cyber aware and safe online
- Q&A session and time to share resources

We cannot emphasise enough the importance of your role in matters related to online safety and would strongly encourage you to attend this opportunity.

Smartphone free childhood – a Bathwick group

Bathwick parents and carers may be interested in a movement which is gaining momentum. We know the value of online technology, but recognise it can be a minefield in keeping children safe and the impact it can have on wellbeing. The aim of 'Smartphone free childhood' is to reduce peer pressure that sees 97% of children aged 12 owning smartphones. They hope to connect local communities to share a commitment not to give children smartphones until they're at least 14, and not to be on social media until 16. All our children's safety

Important safety notice

We have children in school who have life-threatening allergies. We take all our children's safety extremely seriously and as such the following foods and foods containing these ingredients are banned from the school site (this includes bringing snacks after school for your children or during clubs time):

- Sesame seeds and food containing sesame (sesame can be found on or in a variety of food, including on rolls, bread, oil, hummus)
- Nuts and food containing nuts
 - X All 'Tree nuts' this includes cashew, hazelnuts, almonds, walnuts, pistachio, macadamia, pecan and Brazil nuts
 - X Peanuts and chestnuts
 - X Pine nuts and Pesto

Some food packing uses wording such as, 'This product has been produced in a factory that handles nuts and/or sesame' or 'May contain nuts and/or sesame'. We only ban foods that state nuts or sesame in the ingredient list.

Please remember the school gates are opened around 8.40 and the bell goes at 8.50 - this is the start of the school day and it is expected ALL children are in for 8.50. In order for them to benefit from their education and not to disturb the learning of others, please ensure your child is in on time. Children make progress in their learning when they know more, remember more and are able to do more.

Our carefully sequenced curriculum is built around this pedagogy – and this is one of the reasons why attendance matters so much. Being part of scouting is great fun and it goes without saying that helping young people can be one of the most rewarding things you can do, plus it also looks great on your CV!


